



## Mission and Vision Sunday

#### **Lectionary Readings:**

#### Sixth Sunday in Easter

(Please Note: We won't be having a service like we normally do with Bible reading and sermon and so we won't reading them in the service. However, they are helpful in helping us understand the mission of God and what we are called to.)

Acts 10:44-48
Psalm 98
1 John 5:1-6
John 15:9-17

#### **Joining** in the Mission of God

We are the people of God, the Body of Christ and the Church. We are called to join God in God's work in the world. As we have been reflecting on over the past few months, we can't claim to love God and not love others. We can't claim to be God's people and not join in working to bring the Kingdom of God further into being.

This Sunday we are considering how we might join in God's mission. It is important to remember that mission is not something that we do, but something that we are given, which in turn leads us into doing things.

We are called and commissioned to do work in the world. In theological terms it is God's mission that we called to join in. This is the 'missio dei' which is Latin for the mission of God. The mission of God is what we are given as the Church – mission being a task and/or purpose. The work of God is our work as the Church. We join with God in God's mission through serving and embodying the love of God to the world. Of course the part of the work of God which include redeeming and saving the world is God's alone.

For me we have a co-mission from God. This is a play on the word commission. A commission is an instruction, command, or role given to a person or group. Our commission as the Church is essentially twofold, and the two parts sit side by side. We have the 'Greatest Commandment,' which is to love God with our whole being and muchness and to love our neighbour as ourselves, which is our expression of how we love God. You can find this in Matthew 22:34-40, Mark 12:28-34 and Luke 10:25–28. We also are called to be disciples, disciple other and teach everything that Jesus, as the incarnation of God and as the Christ, commanded us to. This you can find this is Matthew 28:16-20 and is often referred to as the 'Great Commission.' Because these exist side-by-side, I name them as the co-missions of God. They exist as a whole as part of who we are called to be as the Church.

#### Joining in the Mission of God - continued

So, we all have gifts and every gift leads us into ministry, because they are there to help us love our neighbour as ourselves. Even our weaknesses, problems or issues can be used as a gift because they allow others to love us as neighbours as they use their gifts to care for and help us. It is important to note that we aren't given bad stuff in our lives by God, but like Jesus said

when he was asked

about why a man was born blind (John 9:1–12), the situation of other's need present us with the gift of an opportunity to use our gifts, just as our difficult situation presents others with the gift of an opportunity to love us as a neighbour.

We are the Church. We are called to be the Body of Christ so that we can individually and together embody the love of God to the world and to join God in God's mission. Our mission is to join in God's mission which is to continue to bring the Kingdom of God nearer and more fully into being. To better do this we need to discern our gifts and strengths, the needs of our neighbours and the think of ways in which we can bring our gifts to help meet the needs of others. When we love others then we are loving God and God lives in us and we in God. When we love others as God loved us in the person of Jesus, the Christ, then the love of God comes to life in us and we bear good fruit because we are doing as we are commanded. (John 15: 12-17) In this we are also learning to be good disciples.

We have the co-mission of God which is about how we join God in God's mission. What we are being called to do and be as part of God's mission gives us a lot to think about.

Having been commissioned by God with this co-mission we have some work to do to embody the love of God to others and to bring people into the love of God. This leads us to consider how we might begin to discern exactly how we might do this. Trying to discern and work out what exactly God is calling us to do can seem a complex process, and it is in many ways, as we try to work our gifts and talents, look to the needs of others, and work out which needs we need to prioritise and how to work together as the Body of Christ to weave together all the range of gifts and talents into our ministry and service. However, at the core of our joining in God's mission is our using the gifts that we have to serve others in their need and to be served in our need which allows others to use their gifts and talents. Our gifts help shape our calling into ministry as individuals and as a community. Our Basis of Union, which is the document which sets out the basis of our coming together as the Uniting Church in 1977 from the different founding denominations talks about this. It states,

"The Uniting Church affirms that every member of the Church is engaged to confess the faith of Christ crucified and to be his faithful servant. It acknowledges with thanksgiving that the one Spirit has endowed the members of Christ's Church with a diversity of gifts, and that there is no gift without its corresponding service: all ministries have a part in the ministry of Christ.



Wentworthville Uniting Church are hosting (on behalf of Presbytery) a Face Dementia presentation led by Dr Meredith Gresham, a Research fellow in the school of Health and Society in the University of Wollongong.

#### Meredith writes:

"We are 7 Australian Universities working on the 'Face Dementia' project, which aims to reduce stigma of dementia and communicate with the public to help them recognise the signs, ask a GP and get the right treatments and support. Currently it is estimated around 50% of all people with dementia never get a diagnosis. We are focusing on Western Sydney in this campaign where population statistics indicate there should be between 9-12,000 people with dementia, whereas only a little over 3,300 people have diagnosis are registered with their GP.

I am delighted that Dirk is keen to utilise our services to help your congregations better recognise people with dementia to get the right support. We are targeting older people (over 65) and adult children who may be concerned about a parent or older relative.

Our team are happy to provide talks (tailored to audience), run information tables at events, write article and blogs for newsletters, speak to welfare staff/lay staff or other ways to get positive messages out that there are benefits to diagnosis... not least getting help and support to live well. We can use our Dementia Australia Advocates to speak from lived experience of dementia as well".
