

The Bible in the Twenty-First Century

The Bible has been described as one foundation blocks of the Christian faith. It bears witness to the covenantal relationship that Yahweh ('I am who I am' / or 'I will be who I will be') established with the people of Israel. It is the only written record that we have that bears witness to the ministry of Jesus Christ that comes to us from the first century – other than a small passing reference in one of the works of a Jewish historian by the name of Josephus. It is the only source we have for the writings of Paul and how the early church came into existence.

The word Bible comes from the Greek word for 'books'. It is really a library of books made up of many styles and genres, and with many different authors (most of whom are anonymous). Its contents being written down and then being closed into the books and order we have to day took many centuries. It is as such a most unusual book – and yet it is not only foundational to the Christian faith. It has played an important part in the evolution of the English language; it has led to works of art and music; its influence is well beyond the culture of the church.

Something of this process of coming into being is caught in the following contemporary hymn by Brian Wren. (https://www.youtube.com/watch? v=0fBnZ0C8Tj4)

Deep in the shadows of the past, Far out from settled lands, Some nomads travelled with their God Across the desert sands. The dawn of hope for humankind Was glimpsed by them alone— A promise calling them ahead, A future yet unknown.

While others bowed to changeless gods, They met a mystery: God with an uncompleted name, 'I am what I will be'; And by their tents, around their fires, In story, song and law, They praised, remembered, handed on A past that promised more. From Abraham to Nazareth The promise changed and grew, While some, remembering the past, Recorded what they knew. And some, in letters or laments, In prophecy and praise, Recovered, held, and re-expressed New hope for changing days.

For all the writings that survived, For leaders, long ago, Who sifted, chose, and then preserved The Bible that we know, Give thanks, and find its promise yet Our comfort, strength, and call, The working model for our faith, Alive with hope for all.

These talks reflect on the meaning of attention because attention is at the centre of human meaning, Laurence Freeman says. In moments of crisis, as during the present pandemic, what really matters is our encounter with love through the attention we receive. Meditation is a way of exercising our muscle of attention. In repeating the mantra selflessly, we are learning to pay attention to God, and as we enter into that experience, the Word of God is born in us, and begins to divinise us. Contemplatives therefore are portals through which divine love can enter the human condition.

The tracks are entitled: Love one another, The essential teachings of meditation, Self-knowledge, Evolution of WCCM, Listening and paying attention, The muscle of attention, Pure prayer, Meditation for children, Kenosis and the emptying out, The power of attention and The equiveillance of love and attention.

So you may say, 'You know, I have a very busy mind. And I am doing a lot of things, I am multitasking all the day.' But a hyperactive, hyper active mind, too much multitasking, constant distraction, jumping from one thing to another without resting in this work of attention; or rapid bursts of stimulation, which is what we like today – that might seem as if the faculty of attention is being exercised a lot, but it is not. Actually, the muscle of attention is atrophying, is wasting away. It is wasting away and it needs exercise. It needs therapy. The therapy of the soul is prayer.





St. Matthew's Roof Repair update from Church Council

I have been fascinated by the renovations that are underway with the church buildings. There are 2 projects that are being undertaken concurrently involving an extension to the preschool and the entire building roof replacement.

The extension to the preschool will provide many benefits to their operation, adding storage space, staff facilities, bathroom upgrades and more.

The roof replacement involves all three building sections preschool, church and hall. The original concrete roof tiles are being replaced with Colorbond Dune coloured sheet roofing, the hall and preschool high-level timber windows will be replaced with aluminum windows. This is the most substantial renovation ever to the buildings that date from the mid-seventies.



We are immensely grateful to the church community members that have been at the forefront of the project, in particular Terry Oliver (Congregation Secretary) and David Porter (Pre School Chairperson) - from the design stages, the building specification, the tenders from various builders, the negotiations with the Presbytery and Uniting Church finance, and that's just to get it all started.

A project manager was contracted to co-ordinate with the builder, Skope Constructions - this ensures that the pre-school and church remain operational as the building progresses.

So where are we up to now – mid September?

If you have been anywhere around the church - you will notice a lot of scaffolding. The roofing installation is progressing. Additionally, the Church Council has approved 2 important additional works to be done.

- Repairs to wooden frames around the stained glass windows in the church that are affected by dry rot.
- Full hi-pressure water cleaning of the exterior brickwork around the building which has been stained by leaking and guttering problems.



How is this project being funded?

The Preschool extension is being fully funded by the Preschool itself, and it is important to note that the Preschool is providing funding for close to half the roofing upgrade of the whole building. We are very grateful that the Preschool is able to provide these funds, and the Church finances must fund the remainder.

Total roof repair cost, inc. GST = \$357000.Preschool contribution = \$157000

St. Matthew's is approved for a loan from Uniting Church for \$200.000.

Does St. Matthew's have cash available to fund this project? Yes - partially, but we are advised to keep the cash in the bank. We are fortunate that St. Matthew's can retain all its assets (that does include the Watkins Rd Manse).

BUT (yes there is a but...)

The congregation did approve the FY23 budget at the recent AGM held in July.

That budget puts some responsibility on the St. Matthew's community to help to service the loan that is currently being drawn down as the building project continues. In the past this community is always able to step up when there is a fund-raising challenge, we are especially grateful that the community kept up the direct debits, envelopes and Pushpay recurring gifts throughout the last 2 years of stop/start due to the pandemic.

Now we have yet another challenge to meet.

\$1600.00 per month is the target suggested and accepted by the congregation.

If the community can provide that funding - we are able to service the loan without compromising our staffing and general budget.

This is our starting point - certainly not the end of the matter because ideally we would like to dispose of the whole principal, as do all mortgage holders. Clearly that will take some time and many fund-raising initiatives – but we need to get started...
