Growing a Common Heart in Christ as God's People.

As we continue to in this Easter Season, we are reminded of the importance of unity and shared purpose in Christ. In this week's sermon, I will explore the theme of "Growing a Common Heart in Christ as God's People." Drawing from the wisdom of John 14:1-14 and 1 Peter 2:2-10, we will reflect on how we can deepen our meaningful connections with one another and ultimately with God.

In John 14, Jesus speaks to his disciples about the importance of trust and faith in God. He reminds them that they are not alone but rather part of an amazingly gifted and empowered community of believers. Similarly, in 1 Peter, we hear the call to "grow up in our salvation" and to embrace our identity as God's people, drawing from Israel's narrative of hope as being a royal priesthood and a holy nation.

As we explore these passages together, we will reflect on how we can cultivate a common heart that is grounded in the cornerstone of Christ. How can we build deeper, supportive relationships with one another, even amidst our differences. How can we better be Christ's hands and feet in our community and share God's love with those around us.

I look forward to joining you on the 7th of May as we seek to deepen faith and grow together as God's people of the way, truth and life in Christ.
