Pentecost Reconciliation

This week marks the beginning of Reconciliation Week with the commemoration of Sorry Day on Friday the 26th May.

National Sorry Day gives Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples and non-Indigenous Australians the chance to come together and commemorate the history of forced Aboriginal child removals and their continued effect on Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples and Communities. It is also an opportunity for all non-Indigenous Australians to reflect on what they can do to turn sorry into action.

This week also marks the beginning of Pentecost where we see many similar themes to our call to reconciliation. We are reminded that the Spirit of God transcends boundaries of race, language, gender, age etc and that this message of inclusion is radical to the world! (perhaps like speaking a different language). The Spirit of God is with us as we work towards healing our nation and First and Second Peoples walking together in truth and justice.
