Lectionary Notes Pentecost 6

The Lectionary Notes for July 9th Readings Genesis 24:34-38, 42-49, 58-67. It is worth reading the whole chapter. Abraham sends his servant back to his family and the country from which God had called him, to find a wife for his son Isaac. But the servant is first bound by oath not to let Isaac ever return to his Father s country. The servant asks for the Lord s guidance so he does not fail. And in an enchanting way finds the beautiful Rebekah, a far distant relative of Abraham.

The reading for today describes their meeting, Rebekah's willingness to journey to Palestine and the meeting with Isaac. A new generation after Abraham is about to begin with Isaac and Rebekah. Esau and Jacob will follow soon after. (Next Week Gen 25:19-34) Psalm 145:8-14. In particular, All your works shall give thanks to you, O Lord, and all your faithful shall bless you. They shall speak of the glory of your kingdom, and tell of your power. Romans 7: 15-25a. The apostle Paul is describing how sin infects all that we do. For the last five hundred years this passage has often been taken to mean that I am divided and not able to do the right. Careful study has shown that this is a result of a pervading individualism since the Reformation. Rather Paul discovers that the person and the law has fallen captive to sin (note sin not sins). I am captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. Wretched man that I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? This is the human predicament. It is God who comes to the rescue. Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord. (Next week Rom 8:1-11 - freed to live in the Spirit) Matt 11: 16-19, 25-30. The first four verses focus on Jesus awareness that the views in the marketplace, (say the media today), just don't get what is happening in their midst.

The last six verses celebrate that Infants are the key recipients of the news of the kingdom rather than the wise and the intelligent. Jesus turns society on its head!

Then such extraordinary words. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son, and anyone to whom the Son chooses to disclose him. And the last verses bring home to us the very nature of God. Come to me all you who are weary and are carrying heavy burdens and I will give you rest. (Next week, the Parable of the sower Matt 13:1-9, 18-23)

After a short stint in legal practice and 3 years theological training Niall was ordained as a Uniting Church Minister in 1984, serving as minister in a number of congregations in NSW and the ACT. In the course of ministry Niall has chaired various boards, school councils and Presbyteries and was moderator of the Synod of NSW & the ACT from 2007-2011. As moderator he was instrumental in the Uniting Church becoming a foundation member of the Sydney Alliance, a coalition of community groups, faith organisations and unions working together to create a better Sydney.

During his time as minister of Gordon Uniting Church he initiated and on 6 occasions over 10 years helped lead working groups building houses amongst the poor in Tijuana, Mexico. In different contexts Niall has been involved in refugee support programs and during and since his time as moderator taken greater interest in promoting the need for action on climate change and seeing it as a major theological and faith issue requiring a response.
