# Lectionary Notes Pentecost 7 July 16

### Genesis 25:19-34

In these traditions that trace the family from Abraham through Isaac to Jacob and the origin of the twelve tribes who would become the nation of Israel. Through one of those tribes, that of Joseph, the families come to Egypt setting the scene for the birth of the nation. In the book of Exodus, the great exodus from Egypt happens. In the book of Exodus, Moses leads the people from bondage in Egypt to freedom on the way to the promised land under Moses. The rest of that story follows in the next four books. It is these first five books that are called the Torah. The Torah is that narrative of God's calling this nation into being, not as many think just the ten commandments. This passage highlights the birth of Rebekah's twins, Esau and Jacob. Jacob born, minutes after Esau, later seeks his brother's first born blessing of his Father Isaac for his future.

(Next Week Gen 28:10-19a Jacob flees for his life and discovers the presence of God in a dream)

### Psalm 119:105-112

Psalm 119 is an alphabet acrostic, with the first line of 8 lines starting with the Hebrew alphabet. So 22 letters x 8 lines per letter gives 176 lines. Verse 105 is a summary of much of the psalm. "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." The next 7 lines reflect further on the centrality of the word of God. This verse has been the profound experience of so many people.

#### **Romans 8:1-11**

Beginning with "There is therefore no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus", the apostle shows how God has reframed life through the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus. No longer need we live our life as captives in the realm of sin, now in Christ we are set free to walk in the realm of the Spirit. This passage is a glorious declaration of God's way to life. "If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ will give life to your mortal bodies also through the Spirit that dwells in you." One needs to read that again. The same Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead, dwells in you. Mind-blowing. There is much more to come in this colossal declaration of life in another dimension next week. The Lectionary has us spend three weeks in all in this one chapter.

### Matthew 13:1-9,18-23.

The parable of the sower is found in Matthew, Mark and Luke. In Matthew Jesus speaks the parable from a boat to crowds on the shore. The disciples then ask why he speaks in parables. As in Matthew there are always overtones of one here greater than Moses. Jesus the teacher then shares with them the fuller meaning of the parable. "To you has been given to know the secrets or mysteries of the kingdom." The focus in the explanation is not so much on the soils, but the various ways of responding to the sower's generous broadcasting of the seed, the kingdom of God. In Matthew the forces against Jesus have already rejected him. The parable indicates that whatever resistance the kingdom of God will be generously proclaimed - and there will be a response. The four types of response to the seed of the kingdom, the path, the rocky soil, the thorny soil and finally the good soil incorporate the growing active resistance and passive response to the kingdom of God.

# **Guest Preacher** Christine Palmer

Christine will be known to some at St. Matthew's as she spent some time providing pastoral care to the congregation in the early 2007-2011. We welcome Christine as guest minister on Sunday 16 July.

Prior to being ordained in the Uniting Church in 2014, Christine worked in primary teaching and pastoral care, and all these skills play well into supporting the community in her current role. For the past four years or so, Christine has led 'Suburban Seeds' as Community Minister, in a role involving community engagement and development, along with working towards growing, resourcing, and equipping a local network of faith communities.

Suburban Seeds in an innovative ministry, 'putting relationships front and centre', and 'making connections at the grassroots' as Christine supports local people through online channels, local projects, and through 'a lot of listening'. Essentially, Christine responds to the physical, emotional, social and spiritual needs of the community, and 'connects faith with life'. Mission and ministry are shaped by the character and needs of the community.

Based in the south west of Sydney, Suburban Seeds programs include 'Play in the Park', an outdoor playgroup meeting the needs of young families, Kids Hope mentoring, pastoral care support, and coordination of events at Easter and Christmas, with several other initiatives in the pipeline.
