Lectionary Notes Pentecost 8 July 23

Genesis 28:10-19a

Jacob has pushed too far in stealing his brother Esau's blessing and flees for his life, heading for the extended family in Northern Syria that Rebekah came from. And, alone on the hill country ridge, north of what would become Jerusalem, he falls asleep. With a rock for a pillow, he has a dream. It is a famous dream. "A ladder was set up on the earth, the top of it reaching to heaven; and the angels of God were ascending and descending upon it." That is well known. But what comes next is not. "And the Lord stood beside him and said, "I am the Lord, the God of Abraham your father and the God of Isaac; the land on which you lie I will give to you and to your offspring." Did you get where God is? God is not at the top of the ladder, as so many think. Life is not climbing from earth to God's heaven. It is staggering to realise God stands on the earth with Jacob and promises to go with him. No wonder Jacob says when he wakes up, "Surely the Lord was in this place and I did not know it!" One wonders how often the Lord is with us and we do not know it.

Psalm 139:1-12, 23-24.

What an amazing statement about the relation of God to each of us. The Lord knows each of us in ways beyond that we can even conceive. The psalm begins and finishes with how close to each of us God is. "You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from far away." "Even before a word is on my tongue you know it completely. Truly such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is so high that I cannot attain to it." We find out that while we live and act as if God were far away, we are living in the field of God's presence. The Lord is the one "in whom we live and move and have our being." (Acts 17:28)

Romans 8:12-25.

In this passage are amazing statements. If we put our mind on the Spirit, then "All who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God."(14) As children, "when we cry "Abba, Father!" it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ- if in fact we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him."(15b-17)

This then is followed by the spelling out of the cosmic implications. "We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now, and not only the creation, but we ourselves."(22) Now, however, the hope is given that God is working God's purposes out for the world. This is amazing chapter discloses how God is involved with the world. More to come next week

Matthew 13:24-30, 36-43

The parable of the weeds - another parable of the kingdom. The early church and the writer of Matthew were living through terrible times and momentous events. The Romans had obliterated the temple in Jerusalem. The early church in Israel had been decisively rejected by Judaism. It is not surprising that in the teaching of Jesus, this parable was so important. The parable addresses what it is like to live in such times. The Kingdom of heaven is like someone who sowed good seed in a field, but overnight, when all were asleep, an enemy sowed weeds among the wheat. How does one live in a world of betrayal and violence? The parable is clear, you cannot root out the violence without uprooting the good. Only at the harvest can they be separated. Despite what is happening, in God's time the good seed will be harvested. What a word of hope when all seems confused and even lost.
