HOPE

Lectionary Readings:

Having Hope

This week I learnt hope anew. I was reminded about hope in a real and powerful way. I started the week with a sense of hopelessness. That sounds over dramatic and is if you think that I'd given up on life or something like that. It was about how I started to prepare a sermon but didn't feel any sense of inspiration and had no good ideas. I just didn't know what I was going to do or how I was going to develop a decent sermon, especially in the wake of most of the last weeks coming easily with a strong sense of inspiration and creativity. Yet, in some ways, even though I didn't feel hopeful, I was.

I sat at my computer and started to research hope. This is an act of hope in itself. I was not giving up. I didn't just sit there paralysed by procrastination or hopelessness but went looking for inspiration. I found it and I found hope at the same time.

I started by typing in, "What is hope?" into the YouTube search bar. I skimmed down through what popped up, and for some reason an American preacher caught my attention. I listened and watched his talk. He talked about Romans 15. I didn't really agree with what he was saying or his message, but the passage was helpful. I read through it and tried to make sense of it. It clearly talked about hope, but not in the way I felt that I needed to talk about in an Advent sermon.

It says, "May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus, so that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ." (Romans 15:5-6 NRSV) ...And then the bit that the preacher was quoting. "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." (Romans 15:13 NRSV)

I still didn't know what I was going to do, but I put the passage in a PowerPoint presentation. I then went and watched the Bible Project video for this week's Advent study. The Bible Project is always helpful because of the simple and clear way that they present understanding the Bible, yet not in a simplistic way. However, I'm using it in the study, and we can't play videos in services because of streaming and copyright issues.

So, I couldn't use it in my sermon. I did, though, copy from the video talking about looking back at what God has done in the past to help us look forward to what God might do in the future. Again, this wasn't really what I felt needed to be said in the sermon, but I put it into the PowerPoint.

I then watched a video about people talking about what hope was for them. They had some great things to say, and I started screen-shotting some of their quotes and put that into the presentation. However, this somehow reminded me of a thing that I've done in the past where I ripped off Andrew Denton's show 'Enough Rope' but changed it to be 'Enough Hope' and had interviewed someone as part of a sermon about what they thought about hope and how they had experienced it in their life. I added the intro video that I made into the presentation and will do the same thing as the 'hook' for this week's sermon. It was then the end of the day and I shut my laptop and went home.

That night, I woke at about 3am needing to go to the toilet, but also with a head full of ideas which I needed to get out of my head so that I could go back to sleep. I stayed up and put all that down into an email to myself. In fact, I wrote most of this newsletter entry in those early hours of Tuesday morning. It had all come together. I had a sermon that I felt inspired to share and which I was happy with. My hope that something would come to me, even if I felt worried that it wouldn't.

I found hope, by having hope. I didn't give in to hopelessness. The important thing that I learnt anew as I reflected on all this, was that our hope is God. This isn't some trite Christian saying to become like a mindless mantra for us. It takes real and gritty faith. We have to face the hopelessness of our situation and then trust God. We just need enough hope, to trust. It isn't about what God will or won't do. It isn't about knowing about God and believing in what God has done in the past so that we can hope that God will do something for us in the future.

Whilst what God has done and what God will do is something true and good to believe in, that in itself realistically isn't enough to give us hope, at least when things are hopeless. For me, I learnt again that the important thing is just knowing God, and that this knowing leads us in hope. God is present with us and holds us in whatever is happening and in whatever we are going through. We may not find our situation being made miraculously better. However, miraculously we can find hope find peace and joy, even in the most hopeless of circumstances. It is then, as God holds us and we have hope, that we can hold it for others.

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of God as Holy Spirit."

There is much to hopefully think about.


