## Something to think about

#### 24 December 4th Sunday of Advent

**Lectionary Readings:** 

2 Samuel 7:1-11, & 16 Psalm 89:1-4, 19-26 Romans 16:25-27 Luke 1:26-38 John 1:1-14

#### LOVE

Love is probably one of the most misunderstood, though widely talked about words which everyone seems to know what it means, but finds it so hard to find, hold and do. After, all for our one English word for love there are about five Biblical Greek words and several Hebrew words. One English word which means a whole range of things just isn't enough sometimes.

Why talk about love, other than it is on the list of words for each of the Sundays in Advent? Well, Christmas is about love. As the writer of John notes in the well-known verse of John 3: 16, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." That is why the Angel proclaims, "Don't be afraid! I have good news for you, a message that will fill everyone with joy. 11 Today your Saviour, Christ the Lord, was born in David's city." (Luke 2: 10-11) So, what does that mean or us. Well, in one of my favourite verses, it states that "God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in them." (1 John 4: 16) and so, "Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love." (1 John 4: 7-8). God in the person of Jesus pretty much says the same thing when he says that the greatest commandment is to "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. 'This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is same: `Love your neighbour yourself." (Matthew 22:37)

Love, it is as easy and simple as that: God loves us, and we should love God back and the best way to do that is to love other people. Yet, isn't loving others the hardest thing in the world? To me it is if love is about what the Apostle Paul describes it as, which is: Being patient and kind;

Not envying anyone; Not boasting; Not being proud or rude; Not self-seeking; Not being easily angered; Keeping no record of wrongs and not delighting in evil; Rejoicing with the truth; Rejoicing in all things; Always protecting; Always trusting; Always hoping; Always persevering; And never failing in the end. (1 Corinthians 13: 6-8 & 1 Thessalonians 5:16)

Just think of how many times last Christmas that you lost patience, especially with someone, or weren't patient enough to understand something that they done and so consequently were easily angered at them. Just think how many times last Christmas or previous Christmases where you envied what someone else got as a gift or boasted about what you got. Just think about how hard it is, especially at Christmas time, to not be self-seeking, at least in terms of having a great list of things that you want. Just think of all the people who are on your bad present list. Just think of how this Christmas is probably not going to be any different, and we haven't even touched on the biggies of the list about hoping and protecting and never failing etc. Love is a lot.

Love isn't easy. Love is costly, but it is the most powerful and wonderful transformative thing. A lot of Christians think about the sacrifice of God in Jesus as just being about the cross, but the sacrifice started way before that, probably as soon as we humans walked the planet, but certainly for Jesus, who was Immanuel – God with us, that sacrifice started in being born and humbling the divine into a living of human existence. For us, the sacrifice may be large at times, but there are the many daily sacrifices that we should look to if we truly want to be loving and be followers of God who we know in Christ, and who is with us as Spirit.

Perhaps the greatest gift you can give to people this Christmas is love, and not just a symbol of love in the form of a present, but loved lived deeply and strongly in your relationship with them. And, if you want to wrap this gift up nicely, then the Fruit of the Spirit is probably the best way, this fruit being love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness and self-control.

Love is something to deeply think about and, more importantly, put into practice in every moment in every relationship. That is a lot to think about, but a great blessing.

May God bless you and all you hold dear, and all your neighbours whom you are called to love, this Christmas.
