Trinity Sunday

Lectionary Readings:

Isaiah 6: 1-8 Psalm 29 Romans 8: 12-17 John 3: 1-17

The Complexity of God: Triune – Three-In-One

This Sunday is Trinity Sunday. This is the only Sunday in the liturgical calendar which is focused on a doctrine, rather than a moment in the life of Jesus or a significant celebration. Doctrine means teaching. Trinity Sunday is a celebration that God, who is the one and only god, is experienced by us in/as three-persons. Like a lot of things in theology, our language and our human conceptualisation is limited and cannot fully describe God who transcends beyond) our (goes reality understanding.

Having arisen from our Jewish roots, Christianity, affirms that God is one. There is one god, who is and was and always will be. God the creator of time and space (or spacetime) exists beyond time and space. In our experience, within the limits of time and space, God has been experienced throughout our faith history in different ways – as Word, angel, presence, shekinah/glory. However, when God personally entered into our existence, taking on our human being in the person of Jesus - the Christ, and then the disciples experienced God in the person of the Holy Spirit, and as Jesus used the triune naming of God as Father, Son and Spirit, the doctrine of the Trinity evolved. This is how we continue to experience God, for the most part.

<u>v=0HMryr1ZlxQ&t=8s</u> It is helpful as it addresses the Trinity using the wording of language and grammar as a metaphor, or way, to speak well and correctly about God.

The triangular image of the doctrine of the Trinity also can be helpful. It is referenced in the video. It works through some of the three-in-one-ness of God. God is Father and the Father is God. God is Jesus and Jesus is God. God is the Holy Spirit, and the Spirit is God. They are all one, even though we experience them as three. The next part is where our language starts to reach its limits. The statements about "is not," are about making it clear that the 'persons' of the Trinity are individual and differentiated. They are three persons, but not three people. The Father is not the Son. The Son is not the Spirit. The Spirit is not the Father. Yet, as we know from Scripture, and as the Celtic knotwork backing in the image suggests, the Father is in the Son and the Son is in the Father. (John 14:11) The Holy Spirit is a person of God in their own right, yet we know as well that God spoke about giving us "his Spirit," such as in Ezekiel 36:27 where God tells the people, "I will put my spirit in you." God is three persons in one and one God in three persons.

At this point, whilst we are exploring the complexity of

God, it might be helpful to note how God being spirit, as well as being the Spirit, relates to the gender of God. In principle gender relates to our sex as well as how we identify our gender. In recent years we have seen in Australia and other places an increased complexity around gender. This can be upsetting and disturbing when it goes against what we perceive to be normal. The same can be said when people apply a gender to God which goes against what we might be used to as normal. God is spirit. God has not gender. It could be argued that God identifies as male in the Bible, and in the person of Jesus is male. However, it can also be equally argued that God has not gender because God has no physical body (except in the specific instance of Jesus). The attributing of maleness to God can be said to be from Scripture, but is just as much to do with male dominance in cultures of the times of the Bible and the limits of such languages as English, which often translate feminine gendered words Hebrew into male gender. The spirit of God, as described in Genesis, is one such example. Furthermore, the biological construct of gender is essentially related to reproduction. God has no need to reproduce, being eternally existing, thus has no need for gender. We gender our relationship to God because we relate to God as a person, or personally, and persons in our language have gender.

The Trinity is a complex doctrine which uses the idea of 'person' as modes of being. There are not three Gods, nor does this mean that God is three individual people. The idea is that we experience God in different ways and Gods work happens personally with us and in us in these different ways – which we name as 'persons' of God.

There is no explicit doctrine of the Trinity in the Bible. That is the word 'Trinity' does not appear there. Some people get hung up on this and get aggressive in the denunciation of the doctrine as being not Biblical - sometimes with good reason, whilst others get all defensive and dogmatic about this being the true nature of God. However, even though the word 'Trinity' is not mentioned explicitly in the Bible, there are trinitarian references to God in the Bible such as Matthew 28: 19. There are also passages such as Jn 15: 26-27 and 6:4b-15 where the tri-une [three-in-one] nature of God is described.

The reality is that God transcends our understanding. God exists outside of time and space and outside three-dimensional universe. We use in adequate language such as "God is spirit" to find words and concepts to describe who and what is indescribable using our human limitations. Having said that, God is actually like much of how we think of God. We use language like ἀγάπη (agápē) [love] to describe God because of how we have experienced God as love in the person of Jesus, as well as Creator and Spirit. So, God is how we think God is, or at least much like how we think God is, but always more than we can comprehend or describe. Like the diagram, God is also not exactly how we describe God to be, always being more than we can describe. The doctrine of the Trinity certainly gives us something to think about.


