Something to think about 9 June 3rd Sunday after Pentecost

Lectionary Readings:

1 Samuel 8:4-11 Psalm 138 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1 Mark 3:20-35

More Than We Know

There is a well-known story of St. Augustine walking along the beach one day, taking a break from writing his treatise on the Trinity, a doctrine that we celebrated a couple of weeks ago. Even as one of the most developed theological minds, he just couldn't get his brains around this great mystery. The story goes that he saw a little boy digging a hole in the sand, and then running to the ocean, filling up his hands with the seawater, running back to the hole and emptying the water into the hole. Augustine watched as the child went back and forth several times. Finally, he said to the boy, "What are you doing?" The boy said, "Trying to fill that hole with the ocean." And Augustine said, "You'll never fit the ocean in that hole. Your hole is too small and the ocean to large." To which the boy replied, "Neither will you be able to fit the Trinity into your mind." This story is told in a range of versions, sometimes with the interaction with the boy as a dream, but the point is still the same. Theology is not only our words about God, but it is our thinking about God how our actions speak of understanding and knowing of God, and we ever know, understand cannot comprehend the fullness of God.

It is a good thing to think about God and to try to put our understanding into words so that we can share it with others who can, in turn, share their understanding with us and thereby helping us both to grow. However, sometimes we just need to pause and be with God. Knowing God is more important than knowing about God. Sometimes we need to be like the boy and dig a little and try to put as much as we can know about God in the hole of our minds. Yet, those of us who have dug holes on the beach know that the closer to the tide line that we go, the less we have to dig before water starts to fill our hole of its own. In this way the ocean fills our little hole for it is the same water as the sea. Having dug many a hole like this myself, I know that once I have dug down to the water, the hole starts enlarging itself. So, it is with God, once we make the effort to connect with a knowing of God, it is God who stretches our understanding and widens our minds to comprehend some more. It better to move closer to God so that God can more easily fill our understanding.


Of course, what St Augustine and the boy get right is that the hole and our minds will never be able to fit the ocean in it. The ocean is too large. What we need to really do is to enter the ocean ourselves and dive into its vastness. It is one thing to dig a little and have some of the ocean fill our holes, just as it is one thing to do some theology and have God fill our minds. Yet, it is another for us to plunge into the being of God. Still we will never experience all of the fullness of God. However, just as swimming in the ocean, even though we only swim in one small part, is still swimming in the fullness of it, experiencing God, even though our small experience is just that of our limited perspective, is still an experience of God in God's fullness in some way.

More Than We Know Continued

This is where such things as contemplative practices - such as Christian meditation and the practice of living the love of God both take us from our minds and just thinking about God, to a more fuller being intentionally aware of our immersion in God. Contemplation centres us in stopping our trying to understand what we experience and just sit in the experience. Contemplative practices such as Christian meditation simply immerse us in the being of God and locate us in God's love as we seek to be more mindful of God who is present with us as Spirit. It is good to do the thinking about our experience. Theology is important work, just as is reading the Scriptures, prayer and joining in services as a gathered community. It is just that the theology is often best done as a reflection on the experience of God. Engaging in ministry joins us to the work of God as we love our neighbour as ourselves, and in doing so, live in God and allow God to live in us. Again, it is good to do theological reflection after engaging in ministry of serving others or allowing others to serve us. In this way we better come to understand what we have come to know in God.

Some may be familiar with the Weslyan Quadilateral (see image) which seeks to represent our sources for doing theology. *Scripture* is at the top as it is primary source (especially in the Protestant tradition from which Welsey came from).



We experience better understanding of God as we read the inspired collection of writings about other's experiences of God. Tradition, which could also be the Church, is at the bottom, and in being the Church and sharing together our experience of God, past and present, we come to greater understanding. of God Experience ourselves stands to the left and it is where we come to know God directly. Reason is to the right, and is about our conceptualising about God, which is a form of experience itself. In all this, though, God is ultimately the source of revelation and is at the centre of any understanding of God.

So, God is something to think about and we can dig around in theology and play with God entering into and filling our minds, but it is better to mind the fullness of God by immersing ourselves in God by diving into God and allowing our being to be enfolded in God's being, always knowing that God is more than we can ever fully know or comprehend.
