

## **Church and Religion**

What comes to mind when you hear the word, 'church'? Literally, what is the first thing that comes to mind? What is the first thing that comes to mind when you hear the word, 'religion'? What is the first thing that comes to mind to many in our community when they hear the words, 'church' and 'religion'? How do you know? Do you ever think about it? Have you asked many people, or have they talked to you about it? How much thought have you given to what it means to be Church and what our Church is like?

If we are to be relevant as the Church in our context and community and in our modern society, we need to be able to answer both sets of questions well. Answering these questions is not about trying to work out what people want and then adapt the way we go about things to be attractive to others in our community in an attempt to bring people in. It is about knowing who we are, why we are, and who we should be. It is about knowing how people perceive us and why they perceive us that way, not to change ourselves to correct their image, but to know where things might be going wrong either with our own sense of self or the way we are connecting, or failing to connect, with our community.

This week in our service we are looking at what the Scripture talks about in terms of what good religion is. It may be a little surprising to find that there is little in the Bible that suggests Church should be what it is today. Much of what we think of Church being today, at least the visible tip of the churchberg [Church + iceberg] has little to do with what the early Church looked like and what the guidance of the Scriptures gives for being Church.

Furthermore, hopefully it is not the case, but if Church is a chore, or has a priority rating in our lives which is easily pushed aside due to other things which might be happening, then what does that say about how we have let Church become. After all, WE are the Church. The Church isn't a building or an organisation, although both of those things are a part of being Church for many of us. The Church is us. If Church is not a place where we connect with God, connect with others, being encouraged towards love and good works, and having a community which helps us or provides opportunities to do this, then it is our problem, because we have either made it that way or let it become that way. We are the Church, not the Church Council, the Elders or the ministry leaders.

#### Church and Religion—Continued

In the Uniting Church, the Church in the foundation form of the congregation has the following purpose and responsibilities.

"A Congregation, as the embodiment in one place of the one holy catholic and apostolic church, shall be those members and adherents who worship, witness and serve as a fellowship of the Spirit in Christ, and who meet regularly to hear God's Word, to celebrate the sacraments, to build one another up in love, to share the wider responsibilities of the Church, and to serve the world, and who are recognised as a Congregation by the Presbytery.

# (b) In fulfilling its purpose a Congregation shall:

(i) bear witness to that unity that is both Christ's gift and his will;

- (ii) build up the members and adherents in faith and love;
- (iii) sustain the members and adherents in hope;

(iv) nurture the members and adherents in their growth in grace;

(v) equip the members and adherentsfor engagement in worship, witnessand service in the world as theyparticipate in the mission of Christ;

(vi) discipline [disciple] its members in love;

(vii) maintain pastoral oversight;

(viii) encourage each member and adherent to participate in the life of the Congregation and endeavour to provide opportunity for that participation; and

(ix) provide means whereby the members and adherents may be sustained in fellowship, in prayer and in confession, in baptism and in the Lord's Supper, in mutual reception of and mutual exertion in the Gospel proclamation and service."

[see Par. 23 of the Uniting Church in Australia Constitution and Regulation 3.1.1]

We are slowly evolving our sense of mission. Our mission plan isn't something to just whip up quickly so that we can say that we have one. Our sense of mission arises from who God calls us to be, who God calls us to love and serve and bear witness to and what God is calling us to do in order bear that love and witness and serve them, (which includes Jesus' commission to disciple all people and teach them all he commanded).

I encourage you to watch the little video called, 'The Great Commission, go and make disciples' which you can find on YouTube or use the following link https:// www.youtube.com/watch?v=GNQ-I N07oc It is a nice provocation to get us thinking about who we are and what our purpose is as the Church. It is good to remember that in all this we are called to God's mission to grow the Kingdom of God/the Commonwealth of the Common Good, not to grow the Church per se. If we focus on God and God's work, then there is every chance, given the witness of Scripture and history, that the Church will grow too. Who we are called to be and what we are called to do and how we share that with our community gives us a lot to think about as we seek to move forward
