

Something to think about

2 March

Transfiguration

Lectionary Readings:

Exodus 34:29-35 Psalm 99 2 Corinthians 3:12-4:2 Luke 9:28-36, (37-43a)

Feel free to 'Google it' (or Use the Search Engine of Your Choice)

This is the Cray supercomputer. In 1985, the Cray-2 was the world's most powerful computer, with a peak performance of 1.9 gigaflops (1.9 billion floating point operations per second). Compare that to an iPhone 12 (and we are now up to the



iPhone 16) which can perform about 11 teraflops (11 trillion operations per second), which is more than 5,000 times faster than the Cray-2. Most of us who have a smart phone hold in our hands computing power that was only dreamed of only a few decades ago. We carry this every day and also have good speed access to the Internet

which opens up a world of human knowledge (and a bunch of other stuff like opinions and false-truth and fake news etc.)

What a blessing it is to have such power for learning at our disposal. This can be an amazing tool. Whilst it is still necessary and extremely helpful to have experts in fields of knowledge who help shape and guide our understanding, we no longer have the difficulty or have the enormous effort of having to find the right library, go to it, find the right book and then look up the information we might need. With minimal effort we have almost instant access to so much knowledge and wisdom.

If we have questions about what someone is saying in a service or what they might be saying prompts further questions in us, then we can simply take out our phones and look things up. In fact, being disciples, that is learners of the way of Christ who was God and Word of God, then we should be always on the lifelong journey of learning. Furthermore, we don't have to wait until Sunday or Bible Study night to get into learning about the Bible. We are encouraged to read the Bible ourselves and the reality is that there will be things that we don't understand or things which we can and should learn more about. If we have such moments of inquisitiveness we can feel free to 'Google it' or use the Internet search engine of our choice. Furthermore, we should be seeking to expand our understand and it should become part of our spiritual disciplines, whatever age we are, to learn more about what God is saying to us through the Bible and to seek to understand Scripture better. It is therefore good to get in the habit of looking things up.



Feel Free to "Google it "-continued


This Sunday is Transfiguration Sunday. The Gospel reading set in the Revised Common Lectionary, as noted above, is Luke 9:28-36. Feel free to Google it. When we do we don't even need to have a physical Bible in our hands, for we immediately get access to a range of translations online, these are not just different translations into English, but translations into many languages.

We also get access to amazing tools such as interlinear Bibles which open up the text in its original language. For instance, if we look up Luke 9:29 which is the verse about Jesus being transfigured, and add "interlinear" into the search prompt, then we can access information from sources like Biblehub.com as shown below.

It then becomes simply a matter of highlighting any words that we want to learn more about, copying them and pasting them into another search page with the adding of "meaning" after the word we pasted. We then can find various sources which give us the meaning of that word. If we try that for ἐξαστράπτων [which we can see above is pronounced in English as exastraptōn] and is translated as "became dazzling" we now get in Google an Al summary of its meaning.

The Greek word ἐξαστράπτω (exastrapto) means "to flash like lightning" or "to glisten as lightning".

Ideas from those who can't make the meeting can be shared with Greg Gibb.


