Something to think about

LENT 1

Lectionary Readings:

Deuteronomy 26: 1-11 Psalm 91: 1-2, 9-16 Romans 10: 8b-13 Luke 4: 1-13

The Discipline of Lent

Lent is a 40-day period of fasting, prayer, and charity leading up to Easter. It's a time of preparation and penitence for Christians. According to the canonical gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, Jesus spent forty days fasting in the desert before the beginning of his public ministry, during which he endured temptation by Satan. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of this forty day liturgical period of prayer and fasting leading up to Lent.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday which derives its name from the practice of placing ashes on the foreheads of adherents as a sign of mourning and repentance to God. When someone died, or in situations of great anguish, the act of putting on sackcloth showed heartfelt sorrow for the loss of that person. People would also throw ashes on their head. To cover the head with ashes was a token of anguish self-abhorrence and humiliation (2 Samuel 13:19; Esther 4:3; Jeremiah 6:26 etc.). The ashes signified desolation and ruin. In a similar vein it is a tradition in many denominations to mark ourselves with ash on Ash Wednesday.

The ashes used in Ash Wednesday are typically gathered after the palms from the previous year's Palm Sunday are burned. This provides a symbolic link from one year to the next. There is symbolism of how in some ways our faith and discipleship may have dried up and turned to ash. It is also a recollection of how those who sang praise with palms and cried out "Hosanna!" for salvation [hosanna means, 'God save us'] later were probably in the crowd crying out, "Crucify him!"

Lent is a time of preparation for Easter, lasting forty days, not counting the Sundays, which ends at sunset on Easter Saturday. Easter itself lasts for fifty days from Easter Day to Pentecost, and so we have the 'Great Ninety Days'. In this time of preparation during Lent, we are encouraged through prayer, fasting and acts of generosity and compassion to reflect on the love of God for us. It is a time of a changing of our minds to re-orient ourselves to the Kingdom of God and God's will and way that we learn through God in the person of Jesus, the Christ.

Violet (or reddish purple) is the colour of Lent.

Various rites leading up to and carrying through Lent provide a firm focus on discipleship, and the love, grace and mercy of God which is manifest in the story of Easter.

The day before Ash Wednesday is known as Shrove Tuesday (or colloquially as Pancake Day). It is the feast before the fast, traditionally the time when all meat, dairy and egg products were consumed prior to Lent. Shrive means to hear one's confession, assign penance and absolve someone from their sin.

Lent is often a time for reflection upon our discipleship and the Christ that we follow. Are there things that you need to give up? Are there things that you need to take up? Are there things that might help you live better and love more deeply? Maybe this season of Lent God might be calling you to explore some of these things.

How is Lent observed?

- Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Thursday.
- Some Christians give up certain foods, such as meat, fish, eggs, and dairy.
- Others give up something they enjoy, like chocolate or cake.
- People are marked with ashes on their foreheads during Ash Wednesday services.
- Almsgiving, or giving money or food to the poor, is encouraged.

People also take up more intentionally some spiritual disciplines such as prayer, reading scripture, Lenten Bible studies or meditation and contemplation.

Why is Lent observed?

- Lent commemorates Jesus's 40 days of fasting and temptation in the desert before he began his public ministry.
- The 40-day period of Lent connects Christians to important biblical accounts, such as Noah's 40 days on the ark.

Who observes Lent?

Lent is observed in many Christian traditions, including Catholic, Lutheran, Moravian, Anglican, United Protestant, and Orthodox. Some Anabaptist, Baptist, Methodist, and Reformed churches also observe Lent.

How will we use the time of Lent to move us deeper into faith and discipleship? What disciplines might we take up to help us in this? What might we need to let go of, repent of or stop holding on to, in order to better embrace the love, grace and mercy of God which we will celebrate at Easter? These questions, and the season of Lent, give us much to think about.




