



Revised Common Lectionary Readings:

Hosea 11:1-11 Psalm 107:1-9, 43 Colossians 3:1-11 Luke 12:13-21

How Do We Connect with God?

Connection with God is an important aspect of faith and discipleship. There are many ways to connect with God and many ways through which people feel connected with God. Prayer, hymns, songs, nature, church spaces, people, the Bible, meditation, silence and there are many other ways people connect with God. However, being connected with God and feeling connected with God is not always the same thing.

Theologically, we know that we are always connected with God. We know that God is present in all things and all times and therefore is present with us because God is omnipresent. Furthermore, we know that God is with us and within us as Holy Spirit, nearer to us than breathing. We know that God is the ground of all being, and as human beings that means that we must have our being in God. However, knowing and feeling and believing are not the same

things and it is possible to know something and not believe it. It is similarly possible to believe something and not feel it, especially in terms of the nearness of God.

Jesus was God. He was the Son of God. but also God incarnate - that is in flesh (John 1: 14), Immanuel - God with us (Matthew 1:23). In Jesus the fullness of God dwelt (Colossians 1:19 & 2:9). Jesus on the cross cried out quoting Psalm 22, "My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?" (Matthew 27:46 and Mark 15:34) So, even Jesus, if we take this literally, felt far away from God or that God was far away. That is certainly a sense of disconnection, even though Jesus was fulfilling the will of God and God was certainly present with and within Jesus. In a strange way, we can say that Jesus as a human felt in that horrible moment all the pain and anguish of suffering and felt that was an indication that God as the divine deity had left him alone.

Feeling close to God is nice. I have enjoyed such a feeling myself and continue to do so quite regularly. However, feelings are not the best measure of our closeness of God. We saw this with Jesus and many of us have experienced times when we haven't felt close to God or that God wasn't close to us. However, just because we feel that way, that doesn't mean that what we feel is the best indication of what is real and true. God is always with us as Spirit. "By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit." (1 John 4: 13)

So how do we connect with God? It is first helpful to know how we can know that we are connected with God. There are two great measures that Scripture gives us that jump to mind. Firstly, those that live in love live in God and God lives in them (1John 4:16) and we know that we are connected with God because God has blessed us by living in us as Spirit (1 John 4: 13). If God is in us as Spirit, then we know that we are really and truly connected on our part by the evidence of manifestation of the Fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5: 22-25). If we abide in Christ then we will be bearing much fruit (John 15: 5). If we are living love then we know God and are showing our connection with Go, and such parables as the Sheep and Goats (Matthew 25:31-46) confirm this because whenever we care for the poor and the needy and live out love then we are doing it as the Body of Christ for Christ. Thus, if we want to be connected with God, the we should do as God wants and act as if we are connected with God, and we will be.

Colossians 3: 12-17 is helpful if we want to be connected with God. "Therefore, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Chris rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him."

Hymns and spiritual songs are good helps for connecting with God, but doing the hard work of loving people in action and in deeds is the real way to connect with God. Reading the Bible and coming to church services are helpful, even sharing in the sacraments can help us connect with God, but the only way to know if they are working is to see the fruit of that connection in our manifesting the Fuit of the Spirit or the marks of love in 1 Corinthians 13: 4-8. Praying can help connect with God, especially in the way of the Psalms, but in the end whether we feel it or not, when we live in love and live out love, then we are connected in the fullest way with God who is love.

How to be connected with God is straightforward, but not easy. Feeling connected with God is even more mysterious. I don't think that we can ever be guaranteed any way of feeling connected with God. Feelings are fickle, Feelings are fickle. One day they're up, one day they're down, and other days we can't seem to find them at all. We learn in Jesus, that even when we are doing our best to be connected with God and completely embodying the love of God just as he did on the Cross, we may not feel close, in fact we may even feel the opposite. Whilst it is not a case of 'fake it till you make it' acting as we are called by God and making the best effort to life the way of God will lead us in the best way to being connected with God, whether we feel it or not. How we go about doing that in our daily choices and daily relationships thus gives us something to think about.



How doing little things makes a big difference.

On 6 and 9 August 2025, the world will commemorate 80 years since the catastrophic atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. In 1945, two cities were utterly destroyed and more than 200,000 lives were lost. Modern nuclear weapons are even more devastating.

As these significant anniversaries approach, Uniting Church President Rev Charissa Suli has written to Prime Minister Anthony Albanese and Foreign Minister Penny Wong urging the Australian Government to immediately sign and ratify the <u>Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons</u> (TPNW).

In her letter, Rev Suli said the anniversaries were "a solemn reminder of the catastrophic consequences of nuclear warfare," and called on the Government to show leadership in advancing global disarmament.

"For more than four decades, the Uniting Church in Australia has rejected the use, proliferation and threat of nuclear weapons in the strongest possible terms," she wrote.

"These weapons are morally indefensible and fundamentally incompatible with the Gospel of Christ, which calls us to be peacemakers and reconcilers in a world where violence and enmity threaten human life and God's creation."

Rev Suli affirmed the Government's stated commitment to a world without nuclear weapons, but urged more decisive action.

"We urge you now to translate those commitments into action by immediately signing and ratifying the TPNW and offering leadership in international disarmament efforts for the sake of the whole creation."

As a peacemaking Church following Jesus, the prince of peace, the Uniting Church has long stood in opposition to nuclear weapons and nuclear testing. The Uniting Church Assembly is a member organisation of the International Campaign for the Abolition of Nuclear Weapons (ICAN), joining with them in calling for Australia to immediately sign and ratify the Treaty.
