Something to think about 10 August Pentecost 9

Revised Common Lectionary Readings:

Isaiah 1:1, 10-20 Psalm 50:1-8, 22-23 Hebrews 11:1-3, 8-16 Luke 12:32-40

High Quality Connections

Connection with God is an important aspect of faith and discipleship. It is good to have a high quality and consistent connection with God – God as Creator; God as Christ; God who is always present, nearer to us than breathing, as Holy Spirit. However, as the Church, the Body of Christ, our community of faith, we also need to consider how we foster high quality connection with each other: across ages, across cultures, across different congregations or groups o people meeting at different times for services.

High-quality connections are positive, meaningful interactions that leave individuals feeling engaged, energized, and valued. They are not necessarily long-term or intimate, but rather characterized by mutual respect, trust, and open communication. These connections can be brief encounters or more sustained interactions that foster a sense of well-being and contribute to individual and organizational success.

Most of us know in theory that we are called to love each other by God, especially through Jesus who was the Word of God. We know about charity and acts of compassionate caring through such parables as the Loving Neighbour and the Sheep and the Goats. Yet, despite using such language as 'family' to describe our relationship to each other as the Church, as members of our faith community the reality of the way we go about our Sunday services and our life and witness, can mean that we have relatively limited interaction with each other.

It can be possible to be in a room with people each week for years, being the Church together, and 'worshipping' together as a gathered community, but knowing little of each other, and maybe not even knowing each other's name. This is where the discipline of creating high quality connections comes into play for us as the people of God. We are encouraged in Hebrews 10: 23-25 to not give up meeting together, in order to encourage one another to love and good works. We need to disciple others, especially our younger members and those new to faith and our community, and this is best done not just by a limited few volunteers, but as the whole Church together. Of course, volunteers who lead groups are important and play a crucial role, but being known, loved and cared for, and because of that, feeling that we have a place in the community is even more important.

"Teenagers know they are important because they are involved in ministry. They are treated as full-fledged members of the church, not just kids to be entertained." [Growing Young: 6 Essential Strategies to Help Young People Discover and Love Your Church.' by Kara Powell, Jake Mulder, and Brad Griffin] I believe this is true, though for all of us. We need to be creating high quality connections in our Church and that takes effort and intentionality in striking up conversations with others, but also simply smiling at people or asking them to sit with us, and then talking with them.

Professor Barbara Fredrickson speaks about how we should encourage, positivity resonance. This is where our positivity resonates with others. It comes from interpersonal moments, some of which can be fleeting where we notice each other and create a positive interaction. This can lead to co-experienced emotion, where things like us being nice, makes others feel nice and we in turn also experience nice feelings. As the Church we are supposed to love each other as Christ commanded us and that others will know that we are followers of Jesus, who was God with us, by our love. [John 13:34 -35] Barbara Fredrickson speak about how kind-hearted synchrony over times builds embodied rapport, social bonds, commitment, loyalty and trust. All of these are important aspects of being a caring faith community where people feel that they are truly welcome and belong.

So, if we want to be a goodly, Godly, great Church then we should be doing the Fruit of the Spirit and living the love of God, in the kind of ways Paul writes about in 1 Corinthians 13: 4-6. We should be doing the Fruit and Living the love by getting to know each other, valuing each other – even if we are radically different in many ways, and going about practising our faith together through caring for our community within and beyond Church. Faith is not just a belief, but a living of the way of God and joining God in God's mission together. This is not usually easy, especially at first, but it leads to flourishing of us as a community and as individuals. How might we get better at this growing of high-quality connections? What is each of our parts to play in the big, beautiful mess of joy and love which is (or should be) our Church? That is something to really think about.



The Past for Today

Episode 3 Plagues, Pandemics and Christ

When: Saturday 23 August 2025

Time: 10am-11:15am

Where: St. Matthew's Uniting Church Baulkham Hills.

Led by Clive Pearson: All welcome

We experienced COVID 19 with vaccines, lockdowns, worship on zoom. Only small groups could attend weddings and funerals. We were told by synod to exercise care.

Throughout its history the church has had to negotiate plagues and pandemics.

- What happens when there is no vaccine, no daily briefing, no zoom?
- How did the church exercise its care of those in need?
- What were the costs in lives, ministry, communities?
- Why did Christians behave in the way they did? What did they think?

We explore the above in the context of:

- The Antonine Plague and the Plague of Cyprian;
- The Black Death and the Isenheim Altarpiece;
- Martin Luther's Whether One May Flee the Deadly Plague;
- Responses to the Spanish Flu, 1918-1919.

Episode 4 is on 'Allah': How the Christian faith engaged with Islam over time.

Reducing Corporate Profits from Gambling:

Wesley Mission is asking its supporters to consider using their power as shareholders or as members of superannuation funds to help Wesley with their campaign to reduce the harm that gambling is causing in our community.

Corporations have a huge impact on our world. Investors can change the way corporations do business to have a healthier impact on our communities. This can include writing letters to company leaders or even participating in their annual general meetings.

Wesley Mission is working with SIX Invest to put pressure on the Nine Entertainment media company to end the advertising of gambling on television (#EndGamblingAds). People who are shareholders in Nine and other media companies are encouraged to email or write to these companies to ask them to stop all gambling advertising on their platforms.

Superannuation:

While simply being a member of a super fund doesn't mean you're a shareholder, there are things you can do as a member of a fund to move your fund towards divesting from gambling companies. You can email or write to your super fund to ask if your money is being used to invest in the gambling industry. Let them know why you don't want your money to contribute to causing gambling harm.
