Being the Church, We Have Duties and Responsibilities

As our name, St. Matthew's Uniting Church Baulkham Hills, clearly identifies we are part of the Uniting Church in Australia. Being part of the Church, as Paul describes in 1 Corinthians 12. means that we are part of the Body of Christ being individually and collectively members of it. This means that we as individuals and as a congregation have our part to play in the mission of God through our ministry. The Uniting Church sets out some clear guidelines in our Constitution and Regulations about what our part is and the duties and responsibilities that are a part of that. I thought it worth sharing some insight into this as many may not have read the formal documents which underpin our life and witness.

Purpose and Responsibilities of a Congregation

The Congregation, that is us, as the embodiment in one place of the one holy catholic [meaning universal] and apostolic [meaning both in the way of the Apostles and being sent out (ἀπόστολος [apostolos] in Greek means sent with a mission)] church, shall be those members and adherents who worship, witness and serve as a fellowship of the Spirit in Christ, and who meet regularly to hear God's Word. to celebrate sacraments, to **build** one another up in love, to **share** the wider responsibilities of the Church, and to serve the world, and who are recognised as a Congregation by the Presbytery.

- (b) In fulfilling its purpose a Congregation shall:
- (i) bear witness to that unity that is both Christ's gift and his will;
- (ii) build up the members and adherents in faith and love;
- (iii) sustain the members and adherents in hope;
- (iv) nurture the members and adherents in their growth in grace;
- (v) equip the members and adherents for engagement in worship, witness and service in the world as they participate in the mission of Christ;
 - (vi) discipline its members in love;
 - (vii) maintain pastoral oversight;

(viii) encourage each member and adherent to participate in the life of the Congregation and endeavour to provide opportunity for that participation; and

(ix) provide means whereby the members and adherents may be sustained in fellowship, in prayer and in confession, in baptism and in the Lord's Supper, in mutual reception of and mutual exertion in the Gospel through proclamation and service.

- (c) The responsibilities of a Congregation include:
- (i) participating in shared responsibilities with any related Congregations;
- (ii) fulfilling the ministry of the Church in and to the community;

This is from our regulations, paragraph 3.1.1 - PURPOSE AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF A CONGREGATION (See also Para 23, Uniting Church in Australia Constitution).

We each have a lot to do and it is up to all of us, not just paid ministry leaders or those who volunteer in special roles or get involved in specific ministry groups or activities. Of course, it help to have people doing specific roles and carrying out specific task as per their gifts and calling, but we all have a calling and if we are all not **actively** playing our part, then our life and witness as a congregation will be impoverished.

As seek to continue to be 'growing together' as a congregation after fifty years on our current site, then we need to put our hands to the plough – to take up Jesus' imagery in Luke 9:62. There are things which should perhaps stand out for us. Firstly, we are a community in Christ to worship, witness and serve. I believe these are an integrated whole, not three separate and individual elements. Secondly, in the context of the

rest of the responsibilities, worshipping, witnessing and serving, is not, I believe, limited to Sunday Church services. Thirdly, worshipping, witnessing and serving involves meeting regularly to hear God's Word, to celebrate the sacraments, to build one another up in love, to share the wider responsibilities of the Church, and to serve the world. Reg. 3.1.1.B.v makes it clear that worship, witness and service takes place in the world as we participate in the mission of Christ.

Then, given our purpose, there are those awesome and challenging responsibilities, which are not simply meant to be passed off to Church Council or Elders. We are called to unity, to build each other up in faith and love, to sustain each other in hope, equip ourselves for engagement in worship, witness and service in the world as we participate in the mission of Christ, and encourage each of us to participate in the life of the Congregation and endeavour to provide opportunity for that participation. All of this is wrapped up in fellowship, in prayer, and in confession, in baptism, and in the Lord's Supper, and in mutual reception of and mutual exertion in the Gospel through proclamation and service.

We are called to be a missional Church, not just a religious social club, which I am not suggesting that we have become. However, I think that many of us are right in suggesting that we have some work to do to grow our life and witness, given our purpose and responsibilities. How might we each individually, and as a congregation, more intentionally take up all these vital aspects of being Church together? That is something to really think about.

Episode 3 Plagues, Pandemics and Christ

When: Saturday 23 August 2025

Time: 10am-11:15am

Where: St. Matthew's Uniting Church Baulkham Hills.

Led by Clive Pearson: All welcome

We experienced COVID 19 with vaccines, lockdowns, worship on zoom. Only small groups could attend weddings and funerals. We were told by synod to exercise care.

Throughout its history the church has had to negotiate plagues and pandemics.

- What happens when there is no vaccine, no daily briefing, no zoom?
- How did the church exercise its care of those in need?
- What were the costs in lives, ministry, communities?
- Why did Christians behave in the way they did? What did they think?

We explore the above in the context of:

- The Antonine Plague and the Plague of Cyprian;
- The Black Death and the Isenheim Altarpiece;
- Martin Luther's Whether One May Flee the Deadly Plague;
- Responses to the Spanish Flu, 1918-1919.

Episode 4 is on 'Allah': How the Christian faith engaged with Islam over time.

The word 'Allah; means God; it is the word used by Arabic Christians; it was used long before the English word 'God' was used.

Use the Ethical Fashion Guide (link above) to find out how brands scored and how they rank compared to others. Baptist World Aid assessed 13,000 data points covering 46 questions across three tiers of the supply chain for the brands. They gave each brand a score out of 100, based on how they're going at protecting workers and the environment. Brands are ranked into five colours, ranging from the bottom scoring ones to the top scoring ones.

Click on the brand to find out more information and you can ask them to do better using the 'Speak Out to Brands' tool (link below). If you're looking for something specific, use the filters or sort brands to find what you need. Looking at the italicised line below the brand name will show you the parent company that owns that brand.
