# Something to think about 14 September Pentecost 14

#### **Revised Common Lectionary Readings:**

Numbers 21:4b-9 Psalm 98:1-5 1 Corinthians 1:18-24 John 3:13-17

## We Proclaim Christ Crucified

We proclaim Christ crucified. [1 Corinthians 1: 23] Yet, what does that mean? Why did Jesus, who was Christ/Messiah and God incarnate have to die? What does his death mean? There is a danger that we get caught up in thinking that the Cross is the means of our salvation. There is a danger that we believe in an understanding of what the Cross means, more than we believe in Jesus. The Cross and its meaning are important, and God in the person of Jesus, works for our salvation through his death, but as that well-known verse, John 3:16, clearly states, it is believing in Christ, the Son of God, Word of God, Light of the World, who was and is God, and in whom the fullness of God can be found, that we are saved and have eternal life. It is believing in Him that we are saved, and this involves his work on the Cross, but the Cross is not what we believe in.

How we understand and speak about salvation is part of our theology - our thinking and speaking about Theology comes from Θεός [theos] = God and λόγος [logos] = word/thought/reason/ understanding. The aspect of theology about salvation is called soteriology. This is from the Greek word, σώζω [sozo], which means to save, rescue, deliver; to heal; by extension: to be in right relationship with God, with the implication that the condition before salvation was one of grave danger or distress. The idea of being in right relationship with God is atonement. We atonement into at-one-ment. Soteriology, that is our understanding of salvation, range of theological а understandings or theories which are referred to as atonement theories.

Before I studied theology, I wasn't aware there were more than understanding of the Cross and our salvation. I had been taught to believe that Jesus was our personal saviour and that he died on the cross to save me from my sin that I would have eternal life. Now, this is not wrong, and the good thing is that it first suggests that I believe in Jesus, but often alongside of this was the understanding that Jesus died in my place as a payment for mine and everyone's sin, death being a punishment that I/we deserved, but Jeus received in my/ our place. This is referred to in soteriology as substitutionary atonement or penal substitution [penal referring to penalty and punishment]. This is a very popular theology, especially in evangelical circles, but it is probably the atonement theory that I am least comfortable with, although it was the one I grew up being taught. I almost did an Honours thesis about this. and the title I was considering was 'Substituting Atonement.' My thesis was going to be about substituting better atonement theories in the Church rather than penal substitution.

Early this year I caught a great summary of some of the atonement theories by Rev Joseph Yoo on Facebook. Jo is an episcopal priest from Houston USA. Here is a link to his Facebook page 'Joseph Yoo+' <a href="https://">https://</a> www.facebook.com/share/r/19jpjSobEn/

Here is my summary of his summary.

Ransom theory says humanity was captive to sin death and devil. Jesus's death was the payment to set us free. Think: Ancient prison exchange.

Christus Victor says instead of paying anyone off Jesus goes to battle with the powers of sin, death and evil and wins.

**Satisfaction theory** shows up in the 11th century. Here sin wasn't just breaking a rule, it was breaking honour dishonouring the King or a Lord or a knight. To make this right someone had to restore that honour, usually through combat and Jesus satisfies the honour debt by winning against the devil.

Penal Substitution Here it's not about breaking the feudal honour system. It's about breaking the law, which requires punishment for justice to be done. Jesus takes the punishment in our place. In this case the punishment for sin is death and he substitutes himself for us.

Moral influence theory says Jesus's love changes us. Jesus' death moves our hearts to live differently, it's not about wrath. It's about transformation.

Scapegoat theory says we as people must have someone to blame and Jesus becomes that scapegoat, not because God demands blood, but because we humans do, and someone has to take away that blame by being the sacrifice.

How do you understand the cross? What theory or theories of atonement do you subscribe to? Why are they the ones that you believe and are part of your theology? This is something to think about. However, in all this it is really important to remember that it is God, whom we know as Christ and experience as the Holy Spirit that we should believe in, rather than a theory of how God works our salvation.

Let me finish with the words Rev Joseph Yoo finishes with. "These theories aren't gospel itself. They are ways to understand it, and how you interpret the cross shapes how you see God, so let me just say this plainly, Jesus didn't come to change God's mind about us. He came to show us what God's mind has always been. And what has been God's mind from the start? Love. Hope that helps."



#### **Topic:** The Crisis in Palestine – a Christian Perspective

The Palestine Israel Ecumenical Network Inc (PIEN) is a network of Australian Christians and supporters, seeking lasting peace and justice for the people of Palestine and Israel. Their goal is to:

Encourage and equip Australian churches to promote peace and reconciliation in Palestine and Israel, inspired by Christ's vision for universal reconciliation.

Educate Australian churches and the wider public on human rights issues in Palestine and Israel.

Seek public policy change in Australia.

Influence public opinion and advance public debate.

Encourage theological discussion and practical action.

Express solidarity with Palestinian Christians and with others who genuinely seek peace and justice for all Palestinians and Israelis.

Work alongside like-minded organisations in Australia and overseas.

Participate in the Australia Palestine Advocacy Network (APAN)'s advocacy work with parliamentarians and the Australian community.

The network includes around 800 people, from over eleven different denominations, across all parts of Australia as well as Australian Christian aid and development agencies working in Palestine and Israel. PIEN was established in 2006 by church leaders who saw a particular role for Christians to advocate from a faith perspective about Palestinian human rights. PIEN are an independent working group that has a formal relationship with the ACT Council of Churches.

#### **Further Reading:**

PIEN recently published the 'Joint Statement by the Greek Orthodox Patriarchate of Jerusalem and the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem - Jerusalem August 26th,2025' that states: 'with equal urgency, we appeal to the international community to act for an end of this senseless and destructive war, and for the return of the missing people and the Israeli hostages.' It is a very interesting statement that includes the current Christian churches' action in Palestine.
