Something to think about 28 September Pentecost 16

Revised Common Lectionary Readings:

Jeremiah 32:1-3a, 6-15 Psalm 91:1-6, 14-16 1 Timothy 6:6-19 Luke 16:19-31

Faith and Politics

For people of faith, engagement in politics is almost always a certainty. By politics I do not mean party politics or petty politics, but "the activities of the government, members of law-making organizations, or people who try to influence the way a country is governed." We are called to join in God's mission to proclaim the Kingdom of God being at hand and to work for its fuller realisation. We have a prophetic call to speak up and out on moral issues, particularly about justice for the poor.

Being aligned with a political party or faction is everyone's right and all are free to do so, but there is a problem with aligning a party or faction with religion and worse when it is the other way around and religion aligns itself with political parties and factions. We are called to speak out about moral issues, at least offer our perspective, which should be founded in good biblical basis. Yet, to throw our lot in as a religion for one group or the other is very problematic.

There is nothing wrong with having a leaning towards or a preference for or being a member of a political party. We get to choose. However, it is almost always wrong to seek to support a party and its policies with a naïve notion that it is aligned with the way of Jesus. The way of Jesus challenges us and our way of living. IT has always been the case that the radicality of Christ outstrips even the most well-intentioned groups. So, it is logical that there is a good chance that quite often the way of Jesus will not align with any particular political party and its policies.

All this is to note that the Uniting Church supports the current stance of the Australian Government towards the recognition of a Palestinian State. The Uniting Church in Australia supports the stance of The World Council of Churches.

The Uniting Church is not aligned with the Labour Party which is the government of today, although members of the church, such as Penny Wong (who is a congregant of Pilgrim Uniting Church in Adelaide), are members of such parties. Our Church, that is the national leadership of the Church through the Assembly Standing Committee, applaud the action by the Australian Government in relation to recognition of a Palestian state (of which terrorist organisations such as Hamas should have no part), but at the same time condemn other policies and positions. This is because we stand with God and work for principles of God' Kingdom, human political party allegiances.

We speak into politics, not allowing politics to speak into faith, at least not in determining our stance on faith. Our stance on public policies should be grounded in faith, but our stance on faith should not be grounded in public policies or political party positions. State and religion should be separate, in that the religion should not seek to govern, neither should we let state govern religion.

As the Church we are part of society. We follow God, who as Christ, proclaimed a radical vision of human relationship and as the Holy Spirit is at work to transform the world and the way we relate to each other, so that the will and way of God guide us in right living. You may say to me, "Jon, where is it in Scriptures, particularly the Testament that we should be political? Shouldn't we just obey the government of the day?" You would be correct to point me to passages as Romans 13:1-2 which states, "Everyone must submit to governing authorities. For all authority comes from God, and those in positions of authority have been placed there by God. So, anyone who rebels against authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and they will be punished," or 1 Peter 2:13-14 which says, "Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to authority: whether to the every human emperor, as the supreme authority, or to governors, who are sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right."

However, we are not in an autocratic society or a dictatorship, but in a democracy where we stand alongside our leaders in equity in our status in humanity. We can use our vote and our voice to challenge, encourage and educate those who represent us. Let

us also remember the teaching of Jesus who cleverly and provocatively taught about going the extra mile and broke with numerous social, religious and potentially political conventions and traditions.

The Word of God came to us as Christ. The Spirit, who is God, resides in us as counsellor and comforter, but also as discomforter and distquieter. To love God means that we need to love our neighbour as ourselves. This may mean that we stand with them and thus stand against the state when it is perpetrating injustice. God calls us to do justly, love with mercy and kindness and walk humbly with God. What shape that takes for us individuals and as the Church is something to think about.

JOINT STATEMENT

ANTHONY ALBANESE Prime Minister of Australia

PENNY WONG Leader of the Government in the Senate Minister for Foreign Affairs

Effective today, Sunday the 21st of September 2025, the Commonwealth of Australia formally recognises the independent and sovereign State of Palestine.

In doing so, Australia recognises the legitimate and long held aspirations of the people of Palestine to a state of their own.

Australia's recognition of Palestine today, alongside Canada and the United Kingdom, is part of a co-ordinated international effort to build new momentum for a two-state solution, starting with a ceasefire in Gaza and the release of the hostages taken in the atrocities of October 7, 2023.

Today's act of recognition reflects Australia's longstanding commitment to a two-state solution, which has always been the only path to enduring peace and security for the Israeli and the Palestinian peoples.

The international community has set out clear requirements for the Palestinian Authority.

The President of the Palestinian Authority has restated its recognition of Israel's right to exist, and given direct undertakings to Australia, including commitments to hold democratic elections and enact significant reform to finance, governance and education.

The terrorist organisation Hamas must have no role in Palestine.

Further steps, including the establishment of diplomatic relations and opening of embassies, will be considered as the Palestinian Authority makes progress on its commitments to reform.

Already, crucial work is underway across the international community to develop a credible peace plan that enables the reconstruction of Gaza, builds the capacity of the state of Palestine and guarantees the security of Israel.

The leadership of the countries of the Arab League and the United States is vital to

Australia will continue to work with our international partners to help build on today's act of recognition and to bring the Middle East closer to the lasting peace and security that is the hope, and the right, of all humanity.

You will be playing traditional Hymn tunes. If you are able to help on this day, please contact the church office or June Davey.








SHORT HISTORY OF SYDNEY FERRIES

Topic: Climate Change and the Environment – a Christian Perspective

From the introduction to the worship resource written by Rev Charissa Suli, President of the Uniting Church in Australia 'Season of Creation, 1st September to 4th October 2025':

Welcome to the Season of Creation! As we enter the Season of Creation, I am deeply reminded of the interconnectedness of our faith, our communities, and the Earth that sustains us all. Growing up as a daughter of the Pacific, I've witnessed firsthand the delicate balance of creation—how the ocean's rhythms sustain life and how, in turn, our actions impact those same waters.

I recall stories from my Tongan heritage where the ocean is not just a resource but a living, breathing part of our community, a sacred gift from God that demands our respect and care.

This Season of Creation, with its theme Peace with Creation, invites us all to embrace our shared responsibility to protect and nurture the Earth. The theme resonates deeply with our mission as the Uniting Church, where ecological justice and the stewardship of creation are central to our call as disciples of Christ. Romans 8:19-25 reminds us that creation itself groans in anticipation of liberation—a liberation that we are called to participate in through our prayers, actions, and advocacy.

As President, I have emphasised the theme, Threads of Love, Weaving Christ's love across cultures and boundaries. This theme is powerfully connected to the Season of Creation, as our care for the Earth transcends all human divisions. Just as we are called to weave threads of love in our communities, we are equally called to weave these threads into our relationship with creation, recognising that every act of care for the environment is an act of love for our global neighbours and future generations.

I encourage you to explore this worship resource and other resources provided for this season and to actively engage. Whether through worship, advocacy or community action, let us come together to protect and renew the Earth, reflecting the boundless love of Christ in all we do.

As we weave Christ's love into the fabric of our daily lives, may we also weave it into the very soil, waters and skies that sustain us, honouring God's gift of creation with every step we take.

In doing so, let us also acknowledge the deep wisdom and spiritual connection of First Nations peoples to this land. Their care for country over countless generations reminds us that creation is not just a resource to be used, but a sacred trust to be nurtured and respected. May our actions reflect this understanding, as we seek to live in harmony with the land, honouring both God and the First Peoples who have cared for this place since time immemorial.
