We have seen some activities keep going strongly, and other activities have had their life span and are not part of our current life and witness anymore.

The local area has changed. The congregation has changed. We don't see the numbers in the pews that we once enjoyed, yet we still have so many faithful people doing good as they engage in ministries of our Church. We have many dedicated people who volunteer in many ways. We have groups like Shine, Christian Meditation, Coffee and Discovery, Op Shop, Women's Fellowship, Men's Morning Tea and others which continue to be a vital part of how we live out our faith and discipleship together as a fellowshipping community.

We have seen new groups develop such as our Social Action Missional Ministry Team and new initiatives as part of our existing activities. There is much to celebrate.

Our missional development team is currently undertaking some reflection on the health of our congregation. We are using the National Church Life Survey Health Check as a tool to assist us in this. There are nine core qualities of Church vitality that are part of their model of Church health.

As we reflect on these and look to the next chapter of the life of our congregation we will identify much that is good. There will be some area for growth, and maybe even areas of un-healthiness that need to be



# Topic: Gambling lobby's sponsorship of Australian parliamentary sports club

From an article by Independent MP Kate Chaney in The Guardian 10th October 2025

Responsible Wagering Australia (RWA) is a lobbying organisation with members including Australia's leading wagering service providers – bet365, Betfair, PointsBet, Sportsbet and Unibet. They represent the interests of Australian online wagering and promoting the standing of the industry.

Currently the Australian Government are being called to act on all the recommendations of the late MP Ms Peta Murphy's report 'You Win Some, You Lose More' including the complete banning of gambling advertising. It is argued that RWA are trying to inappropriately influence government decision making.

Independent MP Kate Chaney calls on the Australian Prime Minister Mr Albanese to remove Responsible Wagering Australia's membership of the Parliamentary Sporting Club, because it allows sponsors to access 'key opinion leaders'. Crossbench MPs and a transparency group have criticised the gambling lobby's sponsorship of federal Parliamentary Sporting Club, alleging it paid to secure access to decision-makers and entrench wagering's close association with sport.

Responsible Wagering Australia has also been accused by the independent ACT senator David Pocock of "shamelessly" trying to claim it was involved with a running group devoted to eliminating suicide, which was hosted by the Parliamentary Sporting Club. Wesley Mission Advocacy Team advise that as a result of his lobbying against the gambling lobby, Senator Pocock has been removed as a member of the federal Parliamentary Sporting Club over his opposition to gambling sponsors.

The independent MP Kate Chaney, who was a member of a parliamentary inquiry that called for a total ban on gambling advertising more than two years ago, said the club and its event provided the RWA with an opportunity to build influence in Canberra.



# Silence and stillness in every season

Daily readings with john Main



It is not an esoteric practice. Everyone needs to learn that rootedness in their centre so that they can be fully themselves. It is something deeply ordinary and natural. We live in a world that makes great demands on us and is continually threatening our ability to stay rooted in the centre of our being. Stress and all its related forms of dysfunction, depression anxiety and addiction are not rare conditions in modern living. It is perhaps difficult to think of modern life at all without them.

To be stable we need to be sure of ourselves. We need to feel we are standing on firm ground and that we will not have our identity or self-respect blown away by the first storms of disappointment or conflict which we encounter. Meditation is the way to this first and basic sense of stability, rootedness in ourselves. Without it external or physical stability can degenerate into a search for security or ways of self-protection. The essential stability is the reality of our own being, and how many are in touch with that.
