Something to think about 2 November Pentecost 21

Revised Common Lectionary Readings:

Habakkuk 1:1-4; 2:1-4 Psalm 119:137-144 2 Thessalonians 1:1-4, 11-12 Luke 19:1-10

All Saint and All Souls

All Saints' Day is a Christian festival on November 1st that honours all saints, both known and unknown, who are believed to have lived virtuous lives. It is also known as All Hallows' Day and is followed by All Souls' Day on November 2nd to remember the departed faithful. The holiday has origins in the early Church and was established to commemorate a large number of martyrs whose individual feast days couldn't all be assigned.

In the church, a saint refers to all Christians. The word comes from the Latin 'sanctus' which means holy or "hallowed." While the term originally was about everyone in the Church, today it often denotes individuals like martyrs, saints, and other holy figures who are seen as heroes of faith and any person who lived a heroically virtuous life and is considered holy. In some traditions people become these special saints either through formal canonization by the Church through unofficial or recognition.

Their lives are often used for inspiration, as they are believed to be in heaven and can intercede with God on behalf of those on Earth.

As we come into our month of celebration of being 50 years on this present site, it is good to think about all the saints who have made up St. Matthew's over all those years. In this time of celebration, it is good to think back on all those who have played a part. There are those who had up-the-front roles, those who have led groups and initiative, but also it is good to remember and give thanks for all who have just served in the kitchen or the Op Shop, Church Council, Elders, or all of the many committees over the years. It is just as important to remember, give honour to and be thankful for all those who have set up for things such as Garage Sales, Mega Marts or just put up tables for Coffee chairs and Discovery.

As Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 12 about the Body of Christ, it is good to honour all members of the Church. "Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body - whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free - and we were given the one Spirit to drink. Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many. Now if the foot should say, 'Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body,' it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. And if the ear should say, 'Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body,' it would not for that reason stop being part of the body.

If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be? But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be. If they were all one part, where would the body be? As it is, there are many parts, but one body." [1 Corinthians 12: 12-20]

He then writes, "But God has put the body together, giving greater honour to the parts that lacked it, so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honoured, every part rejoices with it. Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it." [1 Corinthians 12: 24-27]



All saints, for us, should not just be about the famous or special saints. They have their place and can be an inspiration, but notion of sanctus/holy where we the get our idea of saint from comes from the Latin sancire means to "make sacred," "confirm," or "ratify" and to consecrate. We are all sanctified in Christ [Hebrews 10:10] In the midst of our celebrating let us make time to consecrate some moments to remember those in the Church that you can look back and remember doing things to help us as individuals or as a community. Let us call to mind faces and names and savour the fact that all who have offered their gifts of time and energy in the Church have made it what it is.

Thinking of all who have contributed to the life of St. Matthew's in small or big ways over the last five decades and seeing that as being a blessing is something to definitely think about and honour.



How doing little things makes a big difference.

Topic: Drug Treatment Reform – from Uniting Fair Treatment email 24th October:

It has now been three weeks since the Government's deadline to respond to the Drug Summit Report passed. We have received word that the response could be released any day now.

Last week, two incredible mums, Lorena and Jess, met with the Premiers office to share why action on reform can't wait. Lorena's son died of an overdose in a public hospital bathroom in Liverpool. Jess's son missed out on the treatment that he needed. Both of them spoke with incredible courage and love, with one simple message: we need a health and well-being response to drug dependency, and access to new supervised injecting facilities.

Their stories remind us of what's at stake, and why we must hold the government to account when their response drops.

This is your final opportunity to write to Chris Minns ahead of the government announcement, to let him know you have high expectations for the response - he needs to know that the community is watching, listening and will keep up the pressure regardless.

The Drug Summit and its report gave us an opportunity to open the door to change - the government's response will show whether they want to walk through it.

Emma Maiden, Director of external relations and Advocacy at Uniting NSW.ACT featured on an amazing interview with the ever-insightful Reverend Bill Crews, to discuss the Drug Summit Report, the delayed response, and what we want to see from the Premier.
