Modern Slavery

Slavery still exists today, and it is hiding in plain sight. Modern slavery is not like the kind of slavey that we imagine when we think of people owning people. Modern slavery is the contemporary exploitation of people in a manner likened to slavery, characterized by practices such as people trafficking, coercion of workers, and sexual exploitation. Modern slavery takes the form of:

- Human trafficking
- Slavery
- Servitude
- Forced labour
- Forced marriage
- Debt bondage
- Deceptive recruitment for labor or services
- The worst forms of child labor,

It is estimated that 49.6 million people live in modern slavery today: 1 in 4 are children; 54% are women and girls; 27.6M are in forced labour; 22M are in forced marriage.

What is Modern Slavery?



Modern slavery is all around us, often hidden in plain sight. People can become enslaved making our clothes, serving our food, picking our crops, working in factories, or working in houses as cooks, cleaners or nannies. Victims of modern slavery might face violence or threats, be forced into inescapable debt, or have their passport taken away and face being threatened with deportation. Many people have fallen into this trap because they were trying to escape poverty or insecurity, improve their lives and support their families. Now, they can't leave.

Australia has recognised the reality of modern slavery. The Modern Slavery Act 2018 (Cth) is a framework in Australia that requires large businesses to report on modern slavery risks in their supply chains and operations. Under the law, companies with an annual turnover of more than \$100 million must publish annual statements detailing how they identify and address risks such as forced labour, human trafficking, and forced marriage. The Act aims to increase transparency and accountability in business supply chains to combat modern slavery.

The Bible can be helpful and unhelpful in helping us understand why slavery is not part of God's Kingdom/Kind-dom/Kin-dom. As abolitionists like William Wilberfoce in the 18th Century found in his campaign to abolish slavery, the Bible can be used to justify slavery. The Bible speaks against slavery by condemning kidnapping and selling people into slavery, and by advocating for the humane treatment of enslaved people through laws that granted them basic rights. While the New Testament does not abolish the practice outright, it instructs enslavers to treat their slaves with justice and fairness and encourages the idea of slaves and masters as equals before God. Furthermore, verses emphasizing freedom in Christ and the inherent dignity of all people made in God's image provide a foundation for opposing slavery and promoting liberation. However, the call of God through Jesus to love our neighbour as ourselves makes it hard to justify owning or abusing others.

The reading in Isaiah set for this week in the Revised Common Lectionary has two verses that might be overlooked but speaks to God's vision of a world of freedom. Chapter 65, Verses 21 and 22 read, "They shall build houses and inhabit them; they shall plant vineyards and eat their fruit. They shall not build and another inhabit; they shall not plant and another eat." People in the Kingdom of Heaven have the freedom to enjoy the fruits

of their labour without exploitation. God sets forth clearly in Micah 6:6-8 that what God desires from us is to do justly, love with mercy and kindness and to walk humbly with God. Slavery modern or ancient has no part in this vision.

Organisations like Be Slavery Free https:// www.beslaveryfree.com/ can help us to be less ignorant about the plight of so many people in the world and they provide resources and means for us to do something and take action in our daily living, often through things as simple as modifying which products and goods we support through our purchases. Being Christian, that is following Christ who was God incarnate - God who took on our being in order to bring change and transformation - doesn't allow us the option of passivity or inaction in areas of justice. Loving our neighbour in the way of the cross calls us to make a difference for good in the world. It is part of how we live out the Lord's Prayer by helping God's Kingdom come and God's will be done. How we can learn more about such social issues and find out how we can learn to do more is something to think about and work at.


